



### Playing format for Shoot Out Darts weekends

1. Each team will provide at least 4 players per match (maximum of 6 players per team) and each match will last approximately one and half hours.
2. Teams can have more than 6 persons as teams can rotate their players from match to match ensuring all their players get a match. Players can only play for one team.
3. Teams can be all men, ladies or mixed and will play against all types of teams. Teams will play in a group of four, ensuring all teams play at least three matches in a round robin format, Friday evening, Saturday afternoon and Saturday evening with the winning team from each group competing in the final on Sunday afternoon.
4. Each match will consist of:
  - 1 team game of 4 players – 1001 flying start and double finish. No Bust-Back.
  - 2 pairs games – 701 flying start and double finish. No Bust-Back.
  - 4 single games – 501 flying start and double finish. No Bust-Back.
5. Each Game to be of 1 leg only and is worth **1** point.
6. Nearest the bull to decide who starts play
7. The team with the highest points will be awarded **2** points. If two or more teams are level on points and a decision is required as to who is top of the group, a count back of games won will decide. In the event of a tie on games one, a three dart shoot out will decide. Highest score wins.
